Canyonside School

The **Canyonside School** is a schoolhouse located 4 miles (6.4 km) south of Jerome, Idaho, USA. The <u>lava rock</u> building was constructed by the stonemason <u>H.T. Pugh</u> in 1920; it was one of four stone rural schools built by him. The school replaced several wooden school buildings in the area and was considered a sign of the region's agricultural prosperity, as farming in the area was profitable enough to sustain long-term investments in its educational infrastructure. The building is now a private home. [2]

The school was listed on the National Register of Historic Places in 1983. [1]
